He is currently Distinguished Visiting Scholar, International Economics Program at the Paul H. Nitze School of Advanced International Studies, Johns Hopkins University; a codirector of the Aspen Institute Program on the World Economy; a director of the National Bureau of Economic Research; and a member of the advisory board of the Stanford Institute for Economic Policy Research and the Council on Foreign Relations.

Previously he was Vice Chairman of the J P Morgan Investment Bank; a director of the American Council on Germany and the Japan Society; and a trustee of the Economic Club of New York.

He has a PhD from Stanford University.
